Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you so much for your continued support.

Ofsted seems a long time ago, however, since January our journey of improvement has not paused; our strategic development plan targets continued to remain a focus for both staff and governors. Throughout lockdown, staff seized the opportunity to engage with professional development opportunities, revisiting planning in the light of recent whole school training and development initiatives and review their subject priorities and development. The Governors, Mrs Ali and I met with our Local Authority Improvement Advisor. She was pleased with our risk assessment processes, approach to remote learning and we shared our priorities with her, including how we have looked at Curriculum Design as a team and utilised Lockdown opportunities for further subject training and the development of our CPS Curricular offer. It was a pleasure to show her around our school and to celebrate our successes to date. These challenge sessions are incredibly valuable for us all

This week, we have been excited to have a visit from our Local Authority Early Years Consultant. Post Ofsted, our plan was to redesign how free-flow learning worked across the Early Years indoor and outdoor classrooms making it truly free flow and with all areas of development catered for, for all children to access. Our children also have greater outdoor learning opportunities through the creation of Mini-Woodies, working with Mrs Buttery, our Forest School Leader. We have a sensory garden and a story circle now within the EYFS outside learning zones, as well as a story café!

In the consultant's subsequent report, she noted

- · 'There has been significant improvement in the guality of provision in the EYFS at Claygate'
- · 'The new EYFS lead has sound knowledge of EYFS practice with a clear vision'
- · 'She has worked tirelessly with the rest of the team to transform the provision'
- · 'Expectations are high'
- · 'Behaviour was excellent'
- · 'Overall, the quality of provision...was good'

I am sure you would agree that this is excellent externally validated evidence for CPS.

Last Friday Year 5 were investigating the force of gravity and finding out that air resistance helps to slow an object down.
