Dear Parents and Carers,

It is so lovely to have the children back at school and I am delighted that our Reception children have started so well too and will be full time from tomorrow! The hum of the school, the heart of our school has returned.

Despite a few tweaks, our drop off and dismissals are working well (or as well as we could hope) and we appreciate you coming forward so teachers can safely hand your children directly to you rather than weaving through legs, pushchairs etc. It is also positive to see many of you wearing masks especially with cases increasing locally. This of course is your choice. Children however are not permitted a mask in school. If your child wears a mask for their journey, please remove and take this away with you. We need to help keep each other safe so please continue to social distance and leave after collecting / dropping your children. Equally thank you for supporting us by keeping children who are simply unwell or with symptoms off school. Our processes have been successful because of our collective responsibility for the CPS Community.

This week, our focus has been to settle our children back into the rhythm of the school day and we are proud of how well they have returned to their year group bubbles. The children have been so sensible about our added emphasis on increased handwashing and sanitising; this is so important. At the start of September, the children are always tired as they become familiar with new routines, the demands of learning, socialising and being busy throughout the day. Naturally, this is even more noticeable this term. Please try to offer some 'chill time' over the next couple of weekends. For this reason, we are setting minimal home learning this week, allowing the children's stamina to build.

Recently, we have been made aware of some social media safeguarding concerns; the Blue Whale Challenge and several new pop up inappropriate videos. Please ensure all devices, apps etc are safely locked, supervised etc.

After this week, to avoid completely filling our website with assemblies, we will no longer upload them but they will be available for children in quarantine via Google Classroom. Music assemblies have begun and children have sung quietly, forward facing in their ventilated classrooms. Music lessons with Mrs Knuckey will begin again from next week, mindful of sanitising instruments etc. Again, we are optimistically planning for some clubs to begin after half term, but these may be restricted to particular Year Group Bubbles.

We aim for newsletters to come out each Thursday rather than Fridays this year.

I would like to end today's newsletter by saying 'thank you and well done' to you as parents for sending your children back and supporting us in our safety measures and to the children who have returned so positively and enthusiastically. This I would like to extend to our Governors who have supported me in the preparation for the safe opening of our school and of course the whole staff team who I am sure have just enough energy to get through tomorrow - they have been amazing!
