Phonics!

As you know, our approach to Phonics has been completely overhauled! We began this journey in 2018 when we started here at CPS. We purchased phonic decodable books and changed how we teach phonics. We use Letters and Sounds and all children have access to high quality learning opportunities from Reception; through discrete lessons. Precise terminology is used, focus phonics are referred to and revisited throughout the week and all additional learning opportunities are seized. There are high expectations for all; children needing additional support are 'scooped up' with high quality and time bonded interventions. Of course, we are aware that every cohort is different and many children's experiences and progress may have been impacted this year due to the pandemic. We are delighted however that this year, we are now able to share that all our Year 2 children passed the Phonics Screening Test; that's 100%!
