It has been lovely to hear the buzz of clubs returning to our school, within year group bubbles and still carefully risk assessed. We look forward to further return to socialisation as lockdown measures continue to ease. group lunchtimes, supported by their year group staff team. The staff feel they know the children very well and are most suited to support a positive and happy break time. Equally the children enjoy being 'together' and do not need to worry that they will be split from their friends. Year 6 also feel grown up and special using the Rec entrance. Free flow in the mornings is also much quicker now and works well, allowing busy parents to drop their children safely and dash off to work! We have also noticed that increased hygiene expectations has meant that children are healthier and we have a strong attendance figure of 97%; this was the figure Ofsted told us to aim for (rather than 96%), so it would be great to see this continue!

Tomorrow, on Friday 30th April, which would have been Captain Sir Tom's 101st birthday, CPS are planning to celebrate his life and legacy by taking part in the 'Captain Tom 100'. Each year group will reflect on how one person, Captain Tom, impacted our whole country during the pandemic and that we can all make a difference! Each year group will individually or collectively complete 100 actions, for example Year 3 are going to collectively complete 100 laps of the field. The children will decide how the laps will be walked e.g. sideways, backwards, skip, leapfrog etc. Although each year group will choose their own way to celebrate this event, it will also serve as a reminder to us all that we are a community together!

## Beginning of the Day Update for next week:

This week we reduced the time for children to free flow into school in the mornings. Reception continued to enter first at 8.45am followed by all other children until 8.55am, when the gates are closed.

As we are now settled into this routine, Register will now be taken between 9.00am - 9.05am. Children begin their learning on entry and pause for the Register to be taken, after which the child is marked 'late'. It is important that every child arrives on time. Arriving 'late' is unsettling for the late child but also disrupts the learning of the whole class.

As lockdown measures ease we are excited to be planning our Sports Days! We have divided sessions across the week more than usual to facilitate social distancing and whilst not ideal for those of you with children in different year groups, we are delighted to be able to have you on site, albeit outside on the field!

# Reminder: Doodle Maths Spring Challenge until 30th April

Doodle are running the Doodle Maths Spring Challenge! This Challenge encourages children to use Doodle daily, to rebuild their confidence in their mathematics. Best of all, those who take part can earn a free pin badge and certificate! Encourage your child to earn 450 stars (or 350 if they were born on or after 01/09/2013) and achieve a 7-day streak in DoodleMaths. Once they've reached their target, you can claim their reward by logging into the Dashboard and pressing Claim reward.



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### **Accelerated Reader**

During Year 2, once a certain level of reading proficiency has been reached, children engage with Accelerated Reader. Children select and read a 'real' book from a wide range of authors and genres at their own level before completing a short quiz on the computer. Each quiz gives an indication that the child has understood what has been read and the AR system collates information on reading fluency, reading proficiency, range of genres read etc. This allows us to monitor children's independent reading practice and comprehension and provides both children and teachers with feedback which celebrates successes and helps set targets.
