Dear Parents and Carers,

This week, the governors, staff and I are delighted to have received such positive feedback from last week's 'Teaching and Learning Review of Maths and English', providing Local Authority external validation for our progress to date. Their last visit was in October. They do not give an Ofsted type grading, but one of the team is a serving Ofsted Inspector. As you know, Ofsted is not due until January 2022 and we very much hope that they too will recognise all we have achieved!

We are particularly pleased that the team recognised the positive improvements in English and Mathematics and that we have not let a pandemic or Lockdowns hinder our progress.

- The teaching of English has **improved** since our previous lesson visits in October 2020, particularly in Key Stage 2.
- The school's English coordinator (Miss Cannons) **leads by example** and understands the next steps required to ensure that the teaching of English is **effective** throughout the school.
- Overall, teacher-pupil interaction was of a **higher quality** than previously seen.
- Teacher questioning was mostly **very effective** probing and extending understanding, and encouraging children to think for themselves.
- The teachers **effectively** use White Rose materials across the school. There are **clear daily routines** in place which are designed to aid recall and transfer learning into long-term memory, eg Fluent in 5. The children are familiar with these routines and can **confidently articulate** how they help them to learn and remember.
- The children were **eager to share** what they were learning.
- They were highly articulate and, in **every case**, were able to identify aspects of their prior learning which helped them with their current work. They were also **able to explain** the methods they were using.
- In all classrooms, support staff were very effectively deployed. In some classes they
 worked with individual pupils or in small groups, in others they moved around the classroom
 while the class teacher worked 1:1 or with a group of children.
- In all cases, relationships appeared warm and were highly supportive of learning.
- There have been **many improvements** in the quality of English and maths education at Claygate over the past 12 months.
- The disruption caused by the Covid-19 pandemic has been a difficult context in which to drive improvement, but leaders are **extremely committed** to continuing the school's journey to 'good' and beyond.

Recommended next steps were 'to continue', 'to ensure' and 'to review' what we have in place; welcome news. We recognise our children are more settled since their return in March and the

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time is right to further develop and embed the numerous improvements introduced to date alongside those planned to be implemented by both the Mathematics and English Leaders.

As Lockdown eases, we have been able to participate in cross school writing moderation sessions. Of course, we have a regular schedule of internal moderation, however, as I am sure you can appreciate, judgements of the quality of writing could be seen to be subjective. A range of writing from a random selection of children is analysed by several teachers from different schools to determine whether judgements are accurate. 100% of our judgements were correct. This shows our team appreciate the assessment framework and what is required to be an 'expected' or 'greater depth' writer for each year group. This is also a valuable opportunity for sharing good practice and networking with other teams. We have further planned moderation sessions next half term with different schools to ensure this process continues to be robust at CPS. Mrs Ali continues in her role as a Local Authority trained and experienced moderator, visiting Surrey schools to quality assure their judgements on behalf of Surrey.

It was lovely to have a uniform sale, where goodies and tomato plants were also sold...as always, thank you to our fab team of parents who continue to consider ways to raise funds for our school and for the pool. We look forward to the full return of our Friday cake sales!


Cake sales will be held every Friday after school for the last 6 weeks of this year – after half term up until 16th July!
