Dear Parents and Carers.

What a lovely week to end our half term despite the torrential rain. Since the children returned in March, time certainly seems to be flying by!

This week, the governors, staff and I are delighted to have received another report providing positive feedback from last week's 'Teaching and Learning Review of EYFS' (Early Years Foundation Stage ie Reception).

A National Leader of Education for Early Years (EYs) was commissioned by Surrey to provide external validation for our progress to date. The aim of this visit was to validate the ongoing improvements and developments in EYs, to ensure the school is prepared for the EYFS Reforms in 2021 and to discuss the Nursery provision for September 2021. We are pleased to have a growing bank of reports, all validating the work we have done to date.

The visit was thorough and involved a discussion with leaders, a learning walk to observe the teaching and provision including the impact of initiatives in EYs, looking at the children's learning journeys as well as talking to the children and staff. A very thorough review and another very busy day! Here is a snippet:

'Claygate Primary have been on a **rapid** EYFS improvement journey and the quality of the provision, practice and learning opportunities are of **high quality**.

- The HT, DHT and EY Lead have a **clear vision** for the EYs and are **all able** to articulate the pedagogy and practice that is **evident**.
- The learning environment is good it is well resourced, areas are inviting, exciting and stimulating.
- The children are **engaged** learners, spending **sustained** periods of time engaged in their chosen or adult lead activity, **happy** to interact with adults and **explain** their learning.
- The children are **independent**; the environment has allowed them to be **autonomous** in their learning.
- Practitioners engage well with the children, ensuring a balance of teaching new learning, and supporting, scaffolding new learning.
- Expectations are high, this was evident from the quality evidence and learning journeys available during the visit.
- Learning journeys show **celebrations** of work and the school use Tapestry for sharing photographs and observations with parents there is a clear **expectation** in place, ie 'we only keep and share it if it is worth doing so'!
- Plans are **very well underway** for the new Nursery provision which is opening in September 2021. The learning environment has been set up to enable new and prospective parents to visit. There is a **clear plan** in place for the spaces and development of the (nursery) outside area.'

We are very proud of the rapid and sustained improvements which have been made and congratulate Miss Dias and the EYs team. We have continued to welcome new reception parents in small groups after school each day; all seemed very impressed with the improvements we have made in Early Years.

**INSET Reminder**: our next INSET is June 7th 2021. We will be welcoming speakers about curriculum design and the implementation and impact of our provision in the morning. In the afternoon we will utilise this to create subject presentations; these will be shared with all staff and with our governors.
