Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you all had a safe and restful half term; wasn't it nice to have some sun!

As lockdown eases, we are very aware that cases locally are increasing. Please continue to be vigilant and follow guidelines. Thank you for your positive feedback re collecting your children from the playground...thank you for leaving promptly and keeping social distancing in mind.

Unfortunately, I have to isolate and will not be on site until 21<sup>st</sup> June as my son is unwell and has tested positive for Covid. Thanks to the wonders of technology, planned meetings will still go ahead and I am able to keep in touch with the amazing Team CPS!

On a positive note, the governors, staff and I are again delighted to have received yet another report containing positive feedback from our most recent review; 'Teaching and Learning Review of SEND'. A practising Ofsted Lead Inspector of SEND was commissioned by Surrey to provide external validation for our progress to date. The aim of this visit was to validate the ongoing improvements and developments to our SEND provision with a focus on high quality first teaching and inclusion for all children.

The visit was thorough and involved a discussion with leaders, a learning walk to observe the teaching and provision including impact of initiatives, looking at the provision for children with EHCPs and ISPs and talking to the children and staff. A very thorough review and another very busy day!

Here is a snippet:

- 'The school's SENCO is very knowledgeable. She knows the children with SEND very well, which enables her to provide strong support for class teachers in identifying and meeting the needs of individual pupils.
- The school's focus on improving Wave 1 provision has been very beneficial for all pupils, including those with SEND.
- The drive towards **high-quality, inclusive teaching** in class has resulted in far fewer children going out of class for interventions. Rather, their needs are increasingly being met in class.
- Fewer long-term interventions are in place. There is a greater emphasis on short (5-15 minutes) same, or next-day interventions. These short sessions sometimes involve pre and/or post-teaching, in order to facilitate greater access to learning and/or check and consolidate understanding.
- MC is looking critically at the timetables of support staff, to ensure that they are effectively deployed for maximum impact on learning.
- Class teachers are beginning to grasp the concept of **ambition for all**, rather than 'differentiating down'. The results of recent non-verbal ability testing (WRAT) have helped staff to **raise their expectations**.

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- **Regular training** of teaching assistants by MC has enabled support staff to have a clearer understanding of their role and has improved their ability to work effectively with all pupils, including those with SEND. This was very evident during visits to all classrooms.
- Referrals to relevant outside agencies are made in a timely manner, where necessary.'

We are very proud of the rapid and sustained improvements which have been made and congratulate Mrs Cunniffe and the CPS team. The governors and CPS senior leadership team endeavour to improve all aspects of our school and are currently reflecting on our journey and our next steps for the new academic year. Our annual Governor Strategic Day in July is invaluable and we will evaluate current strategic development priorities before setting new ones which we will as always share with you.

### Parents' Association

We had a virtual PA meeting this week and very productive it was too! The team reflected on successful fundraisers to date and considered new options for raising money as lockdown eases. If you have any suggestions, please do let us know!

The PA agreed to fund seating for the newly 'carpeted' library of artificial grass as it has a woodland theme, which we hope to arrive before the end of the year. We are also developing a calm area in the link corridor to support emotional self regulation and be a safe space for our children. Our children's wellbeing is very much at the heart of everything we do and this will add to our current provision.
