Dear Parents and Carers,

As you may know, I am still unwell with COVID and would like to say a huge thank you to you all and to Team CPS for your support! I am feeling much better, am able to work from home and plan to be back by Monday.

Unfortunately, we have had a further positive PCR COVID test in Reception and the EYFS bubble has had to close for 10 days. I am aware that this is a worry for many of you; not only the concern of COVID but also how you would manage if your child's bubble closed. We continue to strive to keep our school COVID safe. All staff wear masks in communal areas and we opt for virtual meetings where possible, thus limiting our staff mixing as well as additional adults on site. We continue to keep classrooms and the school well ventilated and maintain our hygiene regime etc. We thank you too for all of your efforts to socially distance and by testing twice a week. Working together, we hope to keep our community safe.

The weather has not been kind to us but most of our sports days have gone ahead...the children had a fabulous time and thoroughly enjoyed their picnic! The children showed our values through their sportsmanship and certainly had fun from the tweeted photos I have seen! Hopefully Reception will have a great sports day experience on their return! Thank you to all of the staff involved and in particular Mrs Gee who organised the events.

Our school is keen to have our teacher judgements for writing validated. We regularly moderate work across the school and with other schools, guided by Mrs Ali who is a qualified Local Authority moderator. To ensure our accuracy with this, our judgements were also moderated externally by Surrey Moderation Managers who visited the school previously not long after Mrs Ali and I joined CPS when they looked at writing across the school and moderated our writing judgements. This session was undertaken virtually and offered our team excellent CPD through high level discussions, reflected on writing provision across the school and provided validation of our judgements. We were delighted with the report we received; here are some highlights:

- The writing curriculum has been transformed. Writing opportunities are purposeful and the children have connected well with them. Rich, diverse opportunities to write; inspiring writers to write for different audiences and purposes. All writers, regardless of starting point or ability, can access these opportunities.
- Punctuation application has significantly improved since the last statutory moderation visit the school had
- Recent narrative work has truly inspired writers. Many have demonstrated a real turning point
 in their writing since.
- Evidence demonstrates that the pupils considered as part of our discussions have made excellent progress. This is due to the rich curriculum provision and enthusiasm of the teachers.

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- Assessment judgements are robust. Teachers are honest and ensure that where some children are demonstrating potential for a higher standard, they are not awarding that standard as they do not yet have a broad enough evidence base due to lost learning time because of the pandemic. They have the child's best interests at heart and we feel confident will make accurate judgements at the end of this year.
- Teachers work together as a team. Teachers have reflected fully on all input from recent CPD sessions attended. Teachers have read exemplification materials to further their understanding of the framework.

The governors and I are delighted with this report and I wish to recognise Mrs Ali, as assessment lead alongside Miss Canons and Miss Thornton for their efforts in developing writing across the school.

Charity Challenge!

Mickey(Yr 6) and Caleb(Yr 3) are joining in a charity challenge to raise money and awareness for the Motor Neurone Disease Association in July. The challenge is to walk 5000 miles during July, to represent the 5000 people living with MND in the UK.
