This week we focused our learning on post offices and shops. The children listened to the story 'The Giant Hug' and learned a song about the post office. We also talked about shops in the community such as supermarkets, greengrocers, butchers, fishmongers and florists. During continuous provision, the children really enjoyed writing letters and postcards to their friends.

This week we also had the visit from Esher Firefighters. The children really enjoyed sitting in the fire engine and pretending to put fire out.

In Mini-Woodies, the children made fairy houses. The children developed their imagination and language skills through an exciting and fun activity.

During chatterbox time, the children looked at the post offices and local shops. We introduced vocabulary such as letter, post, postcard and shopping.

During phonics, we continued to learn about rhyming words. The children continued to identify rhyming words and finding out the words that do not rhyme.

In maths, the children have been practising recognising numbers from 1 to 10 and ordering them.

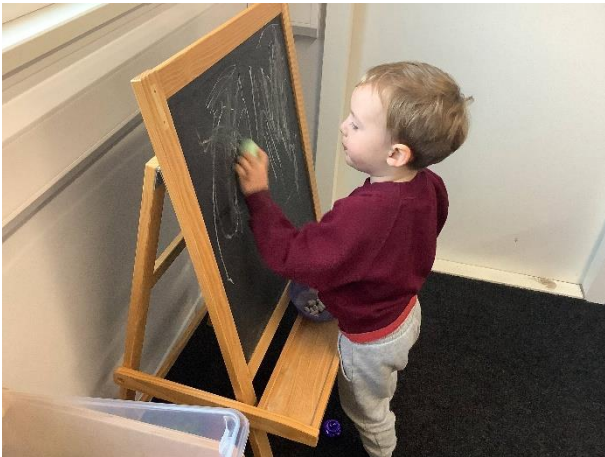
This week's Makaton sign is:
