

#### 11<sup>th</sup> November 2021

Dear Parents and Carers.

I hope that you and your children enjoyed a fun and safe Bonfire Night and/or Diwali.

Today is Remembrance Day, and I visited nursery to share a simple video clip with them at 11am. Children have enjoyed making poppies and many classes wrote poems and pieces linked to this.

In assembly this week, we remembered the service and sacrifice of all those who lost their lives fighting then or in more recent wars and shared some stories from two residents at The Star and Garter.



We were therefore honoured to share some of our remembrance poppies and writing with those living there.

Autumn is certainly with us and the children have now adjusted to the clocks going back! This is also a time of sniffles and we do have cases of Covid, mainly in Year 6. This does not seem to be increasing, thanks to the diligence of the staff and the children themselves but in the main due to parents being aware of symptoms, testing regularly and seeking PCR tests when needed. Also timely communications to the school enable us to alert cleaners as to where to deep clean etc. Please continue to test and to be mindful of symptoms.

Last week our month of Friendship began. Our Antibullying Workshops were engaging but purposeful (in general we focus on 'friendship' rather than overusing the term 'bullying').



Across our Ember Learning trust (ELT) schools, the children focussed on The Fantastic Flying Books of Mr Morris Lessmore, a librarian. Our visiting sculptor, worked with all ELT School children in Year 2 and Year 6, focussing on the theme of FLIGHT and both our written work and sculptures excelled after our 'deep dive' into the book! Some examples of this work are now in the school's entrance foyer.

Enrichment and The Arts are important to us at CPS, so we are saddened that Mrs Knuckey intends to pursue her second career as a wedding photographer full time. Thankfully, she will not leave until after Christmas, but I am sure you would all agree that she has had a huge impact in the short time she has been with us. We will endeavour to employ

another specialist to replace her asap!

We would like to thank the Co-op for providing funding and Mr Edwards who volunteered to help our caretaker, Luis to build our new Woodland Learning Zone shelter. Although we want the children to explore this zone in all weathers, this shelter enables safe tool use and will also be used for group gatherings as needed. Here, the children are creating decorations for the woodland area from materials they have found on site.


Pool Update:

#### Pedestrian Safety, Autumn 2021 campaign - Drive SMART

This Autumn Drive SMART, Surrey Safer Roads Partnership will be launching a new campaign to provide education and engagement on the importance of pedestrian safety across the county. Recent data has shown that, in Surrey, pedestrian casualties make up to 9% of all casualties in the county. Although these numbers are lower than those seen in other areas on the country, Drive SMART believe that pedestrians in Surrey require a dedicated campaign, engaging with the most affected age groups and those travelling at "peak" times, to remind them of the safety precautions that can keep themselves and others safer on the road, particularly during the darker evenings.

This campaign will be focused on engagement with pedestrians – raising awareness of their vulnerabilities and ways in which to keep safe on the roads – and drivers, to educate them on their role in keeping these road users safe, in particular around school-zones and residential areas.

This dedicated campaign will run from Monday 1<sup>st</sup> November to Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> December, with the desired outcomes being:

- Drivers are more considerate to the dangers posed to pedestrians by unsafe driving practices and are encouraged to improve their driving habits to help this cause in keeping these vulnerable road users safe.
- □ For pedestrians in Surrey to feel safer using the roads, especially around school-zones and residential areas with the help of reflective devices/clothing, using designated crossings, removing distractions etc. and for this to then be reflected in the data from this Autumn/Winter period.

10–14-year-olds were the highest age band between 2018-20 to be represented in the data. School age pedestrians travelling to and from school is clearly a risk and the overwhelming majority for vehicle type interacting with the pedestrian casualties (79%) is cars. Therefore, tactics deployed throughout this campaign will aim to target drivers, schools, children and parents/guardians with cohesive key-messages and themes represented through radio airtime, bus advertisements and social media posts.
