**Dear Parents and Carers** 

Goodness - December is almost upon us! I hope you have your calendars ready as well as your warm gloves and scarves.

From December 1<sup>st</sup>, children will be able to post Christmas cards at school to their friends. Please can the envelope include the child's name and either their surname or the initial of their surname as well as their class, ready for our postmasters to deliver them.

Also, Christmas lunch diary dates are ever closer - Thursday December 9<sup>th</sup> EYFS and KS1 will wear their festive jumpers and hats for their lunch. The following day, Friday December 10<sup>th</sup>, KS2 children will wear theirs and have their Christmas lunch. Please note that, as in previous years, this is an 'opt out' lunch and all children will be served a Christmas lunch (even if they normally have packed lunch) unless you have informed the school office they don't want it. We acknowledge that this is not the same as learning and singing songs as a whole community with the teacher in front of you!

#### Covid

The drop in temperature is certainly a shock to the system and a sign of winter's rapid approach! We have now received CO2 monitors for classroom use across the school from the government in addition to the ones we already have. This means that our classrooms should be warmer moving forward as staff will be able to use these as a guide to increase / decrease ventilation as needed. That said, our staff team have a vested interest in having a warm but well ventilated classroom. The heating is on throughout the school at a higher setting than pre-Covid so classrooms etc heat again guickly. Of course the main purpose of these monitors is to mitigate against the spread of Covid through poor ventilation. It is wise on chillier days for children to wear a warm vest / underarmour, bring coats etc so they are warm when playing outside too.

We have some children (in Year 3 as well as some across the school) who have tested positive for Covid and others who are waiting for the results of PCR tests.

We feel it is important to inform you so that you are mindful of the symptoms should your child become unwell. We would also like to make you aware that an increasing number of parents have reported that their child/ren tested positive for Covid yet did not have these symptoms. As a staff team we continue to be cautious and avoid close contact, testing daily in 'hot spots' and of course continuing with virtual assemblies etc. The diligence of the staff and the children themselves continues but it is so important all parents are aware of symptoms, testing regularly (twice weekly) and seeking PCR tests when needed.

**Children who have symptoms** should self-isolate and get a confirmatory polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test. They should isolate until they receive their results. If a child tests positive, they should continue to self-isolate in line with public health guidance (other members of the household including siblings are no longer required to isolate).

Children who have had a positive lateral flow device (LFD) test, should self-isolate and get a confirmatory polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test even if they have no symptoms.

Children who have a positive PCR test, should continue to self-isolate in line with public health guidance (other members of the household including siblings are no longer required to isolate). If a child's PCR test is negative and if they feel well, they may return to school.

Please inform the School Office if a child tests positive. Timely communications to the school enable us to alert cleaners as to where to deep clean etc. and keep us informed of potential Covid outbreaks.
