# Miles4Madi charity event in aid of the Air Ambulance Charity Kent Surrey and Sussex (KSS) - Saturday 26 March

The Roome family, with the support of local businesses and Claygate friends. are organising a charity event on the 26 March called Miles4Madi. The event is in aid of the Air Ambulance Charity Kent Surrey and Sussex (KSS) who in May 2020 airlifted their daughter, Madi, to St. George's Hospital after she was kicked in the face by a passing horse in Telegraph Lane, Claygate.



They hope to raise £10,000 for KSS, which equates roughly to the cost of a helicopter callout to one medical emergency. Families are encouraged to sign up via the website for the bike rides. and a family concert and family fundraiser at Pistachios which is going to be a fun-filled afternoon with food, drinks and lots of activities for the children. There will also be a Mother's Day gift auction for those who would like to spoil their special someone whilst at the same time supporting a charity that provides a vital service to our Claygate community.




# **Claygate Recreation Ground Play Area**
