

Reception Newsletter

11th November 2021

This week we focused our learning on police officers and how they help us. The children were really keen to ask questions and learn about police officers when Ava's dad came to school and talked about his job as a police officer.

In English, we listened to the story 'Dinosaur Police' and the children learned key vocabulary around police officers such as safety, crime and handcuffs. The children drew pictures and used full sentences to explain how police officers help us.

In Phonics, we learned the phonemes 'v', 'w', 'x', 'y' and the tricky words 'and', 'has', 'his' and 'her'. We blended and segmented the phonemes together to read and write different words such as 'van', 'wet', 'fox' and 'yes'.

In Mathematics, we have been learning about positional language. The children were introduced to positional language such as 'around', 'on top of', 'next to', 'between', 'over', 'behind', 'below' and 'on top of' to describe the position of objects.

In Mini-Woodies, the children have been exploring shapes and patterns in the woodland area.
