This week we focused our learning on post offices and shops. The children listened to the story 'The Jolly Postman' and wrote a letter to their parents. We also talked about shops in the community such as supermarkets, greengrocers, butchers, fishmongers and florists.

This week we also had a visit from the Esher Firefighters. The children really enjoyed sitting on the fire engine and pretending to put fire out.

We also enjoyed our trip to Claygate Parade, posting our letters in the Post Office and buying some fruit at the local greengrocers.

In Phonics, we learned the phonemes 'sh', 'th', 'ng', 'nk' and the tricky words 'she', 'push', 'he' and 'of'. We blended and segmented the phonemes together to read and wrote different words such as 'shop', 'this', 'ring' and 'sink'.

In Mathematics, we have been learning about comparing quantities to 5. The children played games to compare quantities with their friends to find out who had more or less.

In Mini-Woodies, the children have been using natural materials to make magic wands. This activity helped developing their fine motor skills.
