

# **Reception Newsletter**

9th December 2021

This week we finished our 'People Who Help us' topic by learning about how refuse collectors help the community and how we can recycle and reuse materials to help our environment.

In English, we listened to the story 'I can save the Earth' and the children learned key vocabulary around recycling. The children also drew pictures of what they could do to save our planet such as picking up litter, recycling and reusing resources.

In Phonics, we reviewed the phonemes 'ch', 'sh' and 'th' and all the tricky words taught so far. The children practised how to write CVC words such as 'chop', 'ship' and 'this'. We continued to practise independent sentence writing.

In Mathematics, we have been learning about shapes with four sides such as rectangles and squares. The children used mathematical language to describe the different shapes and enjoyed playing shapes games.

In Mini-Woodies, the children have been making their own mini Christmas wreath decorations using autumn leaves. The children enjoyed picking up leaves to use and practised their cutting skills by cutting the leaves into small pieces.

The children loved setting up the Christmas Grotto in our role-play area!
