
The children really enjoyed making Christmas tree decorations, writing Christmas cards and making cookies.

Spring 1 Topic – We will be learning about 'Transport'. To support your child's learning you can talk about different means of transport and how we travel from on place to another.

January Parent Consultations – If your child has their birthday in January or July the class teacher will contact you nearer the time to book a parent consultation slot. The meeting will be on 23rd January.

Illness – If your child has any of the three Covid-19 symptoms (persistent cough, high temperature or loss of smell or taste) they need to self-isolate for 10 days or return to school with a negative test result (send a copy of the result to the office).
