This week we focused our learning on Minibeasts and their habitats.

In English, we listened to the story 'Mad about Minibeasts' and we created our own minibeasts book. The children also enjoyed going on a minibeast scavenger hunt around the school grounds.

In Phonics, we continue to focus on phase 3 phonemes, words with double letters and tricky words. The children are now encouraged to read phase 3 words by sight, to be more fluent when reading books and to answer comprehension questions about the story they read.

In Mathematics, the children have been learning about 9 and 10. The children listened to the story 'How do dinosaurs count to 10?' and participated in a variety of games to deeply understand the composition of 9 and 10.

On Monday, the children received a visit from two ponies and enjoyed learning how to care for them. They all brushed and fed the ponies.

This week in Mini–Woodies, we have been developing the children's memory by playing a memory game, pairing different animals. The children have also been practising talking to a group of peers. They chose an animal and described all the key features and the children had to guess what animal they were describing.
