

EYFS Newsletter

19th May 2022

This week we learned about the butterfly life cycle. Our caterpillars are now in a cocoon and the children were really excited to see the transformation.

Nursery and Reception listened to the story 'The very Hungry Caterpillar' and explored sensory activities linked to the story.

Nursery

In English, Blue Acorns drew pictures of the story and practised writing their name. Red Acorns developed their comprehension skills by answering different questions about the story.

In Phonics, we continued to play games to encourage oral blending and segmenting. This week the children played a clapping game to support their oral blending skills. The teacher clapped each phoneme and then the children blended the phonemes to say the word such as c-a-t cat.

In Mathematics, we learnt about adding one more and finding the total. The children used 5 frames and cubes to understand counting with 1:1 correspondence and then adding one more cube to find out the total.

In continuous provision, the children enjoyed exploring mark making using different materials and resources, creating caterpillars and playing with playdough.

In Mini-Woodies, the children went on a spring scavenger hunt. The children enjoyed finding natural resources such as flowers, leaves, small sticks, stems, grass, and petals.

Reception

In English, we wrote sentences about the story using the key words: first, then, next and at the end and drew the butterfly life cycle.

In Phonics, we continued to learn how to read and write phase 4 words ending in ing, ed and est. The children learned the tricky words out and today. We have now learned all tricky words for this term. Please support your children learning them.

In Mathematics, the children listened to the story 'Tad' and we introduced subtraction stories. The children used full sentences and key vocabulary to tell a subtraction story such as 'First there were 4 frogs, and then 2 jumped out, now there are 2 frogs left.'





In continuous provision, the children practised number bonds using pegs, played board games, created kites out of junk modelling and explored symmetry by painting butterflies.

In mini-woodies, this week we have been enjoying taking time for relaxation. We talked about why we need to look after ourselves and to learn how to relax. The children took part in two activities. The children had to lie down and close their eyes and listen to a chime. They only opened their eyes once they could not hear the chime anymore. Then the children had to lie down, relaxing all parts of their bodies and listen to the different noises they could hear in the woodland area. The children identified other children playing, birds singing, cars driving, leaves rustling in the wind, playtime bells ringing and adults talking.
