Dear Parents and Carers,

What a wonderful half term this has been. Our children have been working very hard and have made an excellent start to the new academic year and the children are now looking forward to beginning their October half term holidays!

This half term, we commissioned a full Health and Safety Audit. It is good practice to have external scrutiny and the team reviewed all processes and policies with a huge focus on everything linked to safeguarding. They observed the children at play, around the school and in their learning. They inspected our curricular offer, including online safety. They also spoke to staff, governors and children across the school. Our children reported that they feel safe and any concerns / incidents are listened to and responded to. They appreciated our focus on Well-Being and how we explicitly teach our values, and felt we had a strong pastoral team. They also recognised our robust policies and processes. Mrs Ali is our Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL), Mrs Cunniffe, Miss Dias and myself are part of the school's safeguarding team as deputy DSLs. If you ever have a concern relating to any child's well-being or safety, please do not hesitate to contact Mrs Ali or one of the team. Mr Godfrey is our Online Safety Champion alongside Mrs Ali and he is very happy to support you with this.

This half term, we have also had a full Teaching and Learning Review from the Local Authority as part of their responsibilities to monitor all maintained schools. Again, a team visited and reviewed teaching and learning in action from Nursery to Year 5! They scrutinised how our curriculum is carefully planned to be progressive and purposeful. They discussed our data and how we are challenging all children. They met with senior leaders, governors, subject leaders and staff across the school. They spoke to children and observed learning, including our Enrichment offer. They were very impressed! Teaching and learning is strong, evidenced not only in what they observed, but in the children's books and in what they could tell the team. Of course, as you know both our attainment and progress data are strong and much improved since our last Ofsted, further validating what they experienced first-hand.

We are delighted that both teams reported so many strengths across our school. It is reassuring to have such rigorous scrutiny and external validation.

Our Governors meet regularly and are also linked to different aspects of school life. Some scrutinise Health and Safety and others are linked to different subjects. For example, this week, governors met with subject leaders to discuss learning, look at books and action plans. We look forward to Ofsted's next visit, which is now almost a year overdue. (There is a backlog because of the pandemic).

Progress continues on the swimming pool and the grass is beginning to grow over the trenches which were dug for our new 'soakaways', which already seem to have improved the drainage across our field. We have continued with our programme of redecoration and improvements to the site, including the installation of our new electronic security gate.

At CPS we place great importance on good attendance and punctuality. This also comes under the 'Safeguarding umbrella'.

We know that a child's attendance has a direct impact on their learning. Those children who are regularly absent from school and regularly late do not achieve their potential and do fall behind in class and may well miss out on opportunities to bond with their peers. Please support us in ensuring your child attends school regularly and arrives ready to learn and on time. The school gates open at 8.40am and learning begins at 8.45am!

Our half termly final welfare check placed our school within the 'Amber' category triggered by 95% attendance and 13% Persistent Absence (below 90%). Over the coming weeks, we will be making contact by letter with families of children identified during this visit whose attendance is below 90%. In addition, you may be invited into school for a discussion with Mrs Ali about how we can support you to improve your child's attendance.
