#### Parent Questionnaire:

Thank you to everyone who responded to our survey....we had a staggering 188 submitted, although not every question was responded to on every questionnaire. Some parents completed on behalf of multiple children and the full results show how strong Claygate Primary School is, and also has given some points for us to consider:

- 1. 183/189 children are happy with 3/189 who neither agree or disagree or don't know = 98%
- 2. 184/189 children feel safe with 4/189 who neither agree or disagree or don't know = 99%
- 3. 164/188 children make good progress with 18/188 who neither agree or disagree or don't know =
- 4. 174/186 children are well looked after with 9/186 who neither agree or disagree or don't know = 98%
- 5. 165/187 children are taught well with 18/187 who neither agree or disagree or don't know = 98%
- 6. 139/188 children are encouraged to be healthy with 46/188 who neither agree or disagree or don't know = 98%
- 7. 138/187 children receive appropriate homework with 25/187 who neither agree or disagree or don't know = 87%
- 8. 168/188 children are well behaved with 11/188 who neither agree or disagree or don't know = 95%
- 9. 61/187 school deals effectively with bullying with 115/187 who neither agree or disagree or don't know (maybe have not encountered any friendship issues) = 94%
- 10. 166/188 school is well led and managed with 18/188 who neither agree or disagree or don't know = 98%
- 11. 126/187 school responds to concerns raised with 42/187 who neither agree or disagree or don't know (maybe have not raised a concern) = 90%
- 12. 132/187 parents know about their child's progress with 31/187 who neither agree or disagree or don't know = 87%
- 13.135/187 school promotes equality and celebrates diversity with 36/187 who neither agree or disagree or don't know = 91%
- 14.122/187 children can talk about rights and responsibilities with 50/187 who neither agree or disagree or don't know (some of whom could be because of the age of the child) = 92%
- 15. 118/187 children can talk about challenges they get in their learning with 48/187 who neither agree or disagree or don't know (some of whom could be because of the age of the child) = 89%
- 16. 168/189 would recommend CPS with 13/189 who neither agree or disagree or don't know = 96%

The governors and I will reflect on all responses and would like to thank you for taking the time to complete them.
