Number offered 2022/23

Where a school was oversubscribed in 2022, we have included the distance (where appropriate) from which the last applicant was allocated. This has been included for the criterion under which the last applicant was offered a place. In some cases, vacancies remained after the initial allocation to on time applicants and these were filled by applicants who had applied late. This data is relevant to the allocation date of 1 March 2022.
