A Year 2 writer can formulate and write sentences independently for a range of purposes, with spelling that is phonetically correct. A range of punctuation will be included. They will use suffixes, conjunctions and expanded noun phrases to add detail to their writing. When re-reading their writing aloud, they will make corrections and additions to improve their writing.
