

EYFS Newsletter

12th January 2023

This term we are learning about 'Cultures around the World'. We have been focusing on learning about different countries and languages.

A big thank you to all parents who volunteered to read a story or to speak a few words in their mother language. If you would like to volunteer, please let us know when you are available.

Nursery

During child-initiated activities in the Nursery, the children enjoyed making pictures out of shapes, making marks on coloured salt, painting union jack flags and playing in the role-play area with their friends.

In Mini-Woodies, the children picked up leaves and used rakes to clean the mini-woodland area. The children learned the key words **clean**, **gloves** and **rake** to talk about how to care for our woodland area.

Blue Acorns

In English, we explored a non-fiction book to learn facts about different people around the world. The children enjoyed looking at a globe and finding where they live.

In Mathematics, the children learned about circles and triangles. The children used key vocabulary **side**, **curved**, **straight** to describe shapes. They enjoyed going on a shape hunt and using ropes and sticks to make circles and triangles.

In Phonics, we learned the phoneme 'g'. The children played oral blending games and blended words beginning with the phoneme **g-g-g** such as girl, gate, glasses and grapes.

Reception

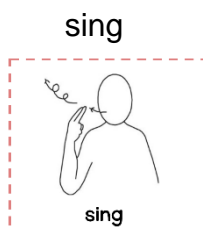
In English, we are learning about the differences between fiction and non-fiction books. We learned facts about different countries, languages and traditions. The children listened to a few key words in different languages and we discussed that some people speak more than one language at home. The children shared with their teachers and friends which language they speak at home.

In Mathematics, we learned about the numbers 4 and 5. The children listened to the story 'The Ugly Five' and used counters to understand composition of 4 and 5.

In Phonics, we began to learn phase 3 phonemes. We learned the diagraphs ai, ee, oa, oo, oo, ar and the trigraph igh. The children oral blended words such as car, night, see, goat, book and rain. They also wrote sentences using their phonics knowledge.

During child-initiated activities, the children enjoyed exploring different scripts and learning about different countries, they wrote letters on flour, pretended to be teachers in our school role-play area and enjoyed dressing up baby dolls.
