

## EYFS Newsletter

26<sup>th</sup> January 2023

We continued to learn about 'Cultures around the World'. We have been focusing on learning about different homes around the world.

### Nursery

During child-initiated activities in the Nursery, the children enjoyed listening to 'The Three Little Pigs' story and build houses for them, drawing and creating their own houses out of junk modelling and playdough.

In Mini-Woodies, the children began to take part in the Great British Bird Watch and learning about different birds we can find in the woodland area.

### Blue Acorns

In English, we looked at a non-fiction book to learn about different homes around the world and the children enjoyed sharing photos of their homes!

In Mathematics, we learned the key vocabulary **heavy/heavier, light/lighter** to compare weight. The children enjoyed listening to the story 'Balancing Act' and used the key vocabulary when playing on the see saw.

In Phonics, we learned the phoneme '**c/k**'. The children played oral blending games and blended words beginning with the phoneme **c-c-c/k-k-k** such as car, kite, kettle and cat.

### Reception

In English, we explored a non-fiction book to learn about the materials houses are made of. The children used their phonics knowledge to write a sentence about the materials houses are made of.


In Mathematics, the children learned about the number six. They listened to the story 'Six Dinner Sid', represented the number six on their fingers and explored the number bond to 6 using part-whole models.

In Phonics, we finished learning phase 3 phonemes. We learned the digraph **er**, the trigraph **air** and the double letters **bb, gg, mm** and **tt**. The children oral blended words such as bigger, hair, hammer, rabbit and letter. They also wrote sentences using their phonics knowledge.

During child-initiated activities, the children enjoyed using shapes on geoboards to make pictures of houses, made houses out of playdough, designed their own house plan and learned key vocabulary related to the topic.
