We finished learning about 'Cultures around the World' by focusing on different celebrations around the world.

Nursery

During child-initiated activities in the Nursery, the children enjoyed pretending to celebrate the teddy bear's birthday by making playdough cakes, singing happy birthday, drawing birthday cards and making a collage of a birthday cake.

The children enjoyed looking at their birthday photos and sharing their birthday celebrations with their friends and teachers.

In Mini-Woodies, the children explored making mud cakes. They added water to soil to create and explore different mud textures.

In English, we looked at a non-fiction book to learn about different celebrations around the world. The children drew pictures of their birthday celebrations.

In Mathematics, the children listened to the story 'A Squash and a Squeeze' and learned the key vocabulary **more** and **less** to compare amounts.

In Phonics, we reviewed the phonemes learned this term - m, d, g, c/k, e. The children played different games to say initial sounds in words and to blend phonemes together.

Reception

In English, we looked at a non-fiction book to learn about different celebrations around the world. The children talked about the celebrations they celebrate with their family and enjoyed sharing photos with their friends and teachers. The children also drew pictures of different celebrations.

In Mathematics, we are learning about comparing length using the key vocabulary **short/shorter**, **long/longer**. They used different objects around the classroom to compare the length of the object with their foot.





In Phonics, the children completed their phonics assessment for Spring 2. During the half-term, please encourage your child to practise phase 3 phonemes, tricky words and reading. This will support them when writing and reading longer words at school.

During child-initiated activities, the children enjoyed exploring powder paint to learn about Holi festival, created a koinobori to learn about Komodo no Hi (Children's Day).
