

EYFS Newsletter

9th March 2023

This week we focused our learning on wild animals and their habitats.

Nursery

During child-initiated activities in the Nursery, the children enjoyed exploring a jungle sensory tray, drawing wild animals, creating an animal patterns collage and counting dots on ladybirds.

In Mini-Woodies, we have been picking leaves, sticks and natural items to create a natural collage.

Blue Acorns

In English, we explored a non-fiction book about wild animals and played 'Guess the animal'. The children listened to facts about different wild animals and tried to guess which animal it was.

In Mathematics, we are learning about composition of 1, 2 and 3. The children enjoyed watching number blocks and playing games to explore how to make 1, 2 and 3 using objects.

In Phonics, we learned the phoneme 'h'. The children played oral blending games and blended words with the phoneme h-h-h such as hat, hen and hot.

Reception

In English, we listened to 'The Giraffe Can't Dance' and answered questions about the story. We also created invites for the Mother's Day Tea Party.

In Mathematics, the children listened to the story 'The Cockatoos'. They then compared numbers to 10 using key vocabulary such as 'more than, fewer than, the same as'.

In Phonics, the children have been reading and writing words which contain two or more digraphs in them, such as, short, chain, tooth, teeth, queen and shark.

In Mini-Woodies, the children created their own habitats for mini beasts. They used string and natural resources to create their structures. We discussed what a habitat is and what insects you would find in the mini-woodies area.

During child-initiated activities, the children created wild animals using pencils and felt tips. They were focusing on adding detail in the pattern of the animals fur and skin. The children





also created their own narratives with wild animals, using they key vocabulary; habitat, fur and wild.
