
Music Technology Learning 2023-2024

Year 1: Blob Opera

Year 1 will explore note pitch, vowel sound and note duration using a quartet of blob singers!

- Pupils will be able to raise or lower the singers to change pitch; pull them forwards and backwards to alter vowel sound; or hold onto the mouse to extend the length of the note.
- Individual blob singers can be muted to create trio, duet or solo sections for any voice part.
- Performances and creations can be recorded, replayed and shared.





Year 3: Groove Pizza

Linking to their exciting Funk module, Year 3 can design their own rhythmic and bass melodic groove using Groove Pizza.

- Pupils can start by selecting their pizza base the number of beats in a bar they wish to work with.
- They can select a variety of genres and drum kit timbre combinations to use.
- There are three streams of 12 beats which they can use to experiment, design and reply their own groove, as well as singing alongside!

Year 2: Incredibox


Year 2 will understand musical texture, linking to their Gamelan and programme music modules, by creating their own vocal band of beatboxers.

- A selection of different beats, vocals, and other voice sounds are available, grouped by colour.
- Pupils can experiment with different combinations, creating a band between 1 and 7 singers, and explore ostinati, vocal harmony and much more.
- Performances and creations can be recorded, replayed and shared.



OBEEPBOx

Year 4: Beep Box




- At Year 4, Beat Box allows pupils much greater freedom to create musically. Beep Box allows children to select four different instruments, voices or beats and design their own song.
- Pupils can select pitch using the height of the symbols; they can select the rhythm of sounds and beats across a cycle of 16 counts.
- Full functionality to play and review the developing song from any stage is available.
- Scale, tempo, volume and timbres of sounds can all be changed and customised so that pupils can make the song their own.

Year 5: Chrome Music Lab

Chrome Music Lab features many different programmes: Song Maker allows pupils to combine digital instruments, drum beats and their own voices into a song.

- Pupils can select from a variety of drum kits and click on the beats in the count to create the rhythm they wish.
- They can select instruments, vary pitch (with colour coding) and create chords or combinations of simultaneous notes.
- An in-built microphone enables voice and lyrics, and other 'live instrument' sounds, to be added and personalise the end result.

Year 6: Band Lab for Education

Band Lab for Education is a sophisticated sound management system which enables pupils to record, select, replicate and arrange.

- Dozens of genres and hundreds of pre-recorded styles are available for selection.
- Every track can be duplicated, trimmed, repositioned to build a customised texture of infinite possibilities.
- Key, tempo, time signature and dynamics can all be amended for any section at the press of a button.
- The project can be replayed from any point and looped at any stage as required.
