



## **Our Expectations**

#### **Independence & Behaviour**

- Please ensure your child is clear on where they should be meeting you.
- We expect mobile phones to be switched off before they enter school.
- Year 6 pupils are role models for younger pupils and we expect them to make sensible behaviour choices, wear smart uniform and be ready for learning. Remember, KS2 cold weather uniform includes a tie.

#### PE Kit to be worn on PE days:

- Grey tracksuit or joggers with a grey sweatshirt or a school maroon sweatshirt for the whole day (not zipped or hooded as this is unsafe - unzipped zips can cause a nasty injury and hoods can be tempting to grab during competitive sports!)
- Indoor PE days:
- Shorts, t-shirt and trainers but may wear their tracksuit over this. No need for plimsolls as they usually engage with indoor activities in bare feet
- Birthday books for class library are welcome; sweets are not given out due to consideration of allergies and religious reasons.

#### **Equipment:**

Children need to have rulers, pencils, blue pen (Berols available to purchase from school 50p), rubber, glue stick, optional colouring pencils/pens



## **Attendance and Punctuality**

- Punctuality is important
- Learning starts promptly at 8.45am with a learning task and interventions
   Children who are late will miss learning, the outline of the day, a positive calm start to the day and can have self-esteem/social skills impacted
- Too many of our children are regularly missing school the government expects a minimum of 95% attendance
- Missing out on lessons leaves children vulnerable to falling behind. Children with poor attendance tend to achieve less in both primary and secondary school (DfE)





### **Attendance Protocol**

- Contact the office via phone or email if your child is absent. If we do not hear from you, our absence protocol is triggered and you will be contacted for safeguarding purposes
- CPS follows NHS guidance (the '48 hour rule'): "Children with diarrhoea or vomiting should stay away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days (48 hours)"
- Attendance is monitored closely by the school and the LA Inclusion Officer
- Attendance below 90% is classed as 'Persistent Absence' and will result in a referral to the LA Inclusion Officer





### Do I need to keep my child off school?



#### **Chicken Pox**

Until all spots have crusted over

#### Conjunctivitis

No need to stay off but school or nursery should be informed

### Diarrhoea & Vomiting

48 hours from last episode

#### Glandular Fever

No need to stay off but school or nursery should be informed

### Hand, foot & mouth

No need to stay off but school or nursery should be informed

#### **Impetigo**

Until lesions are crusted & healed or 48 Hours after commencing antibiotics

#### Measles or German Measles

4 days from onset of rash

#### Mumps

5 days from onset of swelling

#### **Scabies**

Until after first treatment

#### **Scarlet Fever**

24 hours after commencing antibiotics

#### Slapped Cheek

No need to stay off but school or nursery should be informed

### Whooping Cough

48 Hours after commencing antibiotics

#### Flu

Until recovered

#### **Head Lice**

No need to stay off but school or nursery should be informed

#### Threadworms

No need to stay off but school or nursery should be informed

#### **Tonsillitis**

No need to stay off but school or nursery should be informed





### Timetable

### Oracy

Oracy is the ability to articulate ideas, develop understanding and engage with others through spoken language.

- All staff to model appropriate vocabulary
- Children encouraged to answer all questions in full sentences
- Use of sentence stems across the curriculum and in the playground
- Weekly oracy certificates
- 'Ask me about...' stickers to encourage purposeful talk at home
- Further information to be shared during the following Oracy workshops (dates tbc)



## Home Learning

- Set on Friday, deadline is Friday
- Tasks are (mostly) set using Doodle maths and Doodle English.
- Home learning club each Wednesday lunchtime offers children safe space and support to complete home learning. Based in CEDAR class this half term.
- Spellings to practice at home. Feel free to test at home too. We will use a variety of ways at school
  - Children will be tested on seven current spellings, three from previous weeks.
- Useful websites Timestables Rockstars, DoodleMaths, Duolingo






## Online Safety

- Taught explicitly through our PSE and Computing curriculum, plus regular discussion and direct teaching whenever Chromebooks are used
- Consider children's online access
- 4 Cs: Content, contact, conduct and commerce
- Social media: many apps have a minimum age use e.g. WhatsApp is 16 years old.
- Check privacy settings and monitor usage
- Where are devices stored? Is there unlimited access e.g. in bedrooms?
- Speak to school staff if you have concerns or need support





## Reading



- Children are expected to read daily, either alone or with an adult.
- Children should record at least three times in their reading journals.
   Journals will be monitored.
- When your child has finished their reading book, they can complete an Accelerated Reader quiz either at home or in school.
- School adults record in green pen
- AR quizzing at home access via WONDE
- Weekly visit to library to choose a book of interest
- ZPD levels will be re-assessed termly sticker in reading journal recording progress and new levels



The closing date for on-time applications to secondary schools is 31 October 2022.

- Step 2: Complete the application form
- Step 3: Complete any supplementary forms
- Step 4: Applications are assessed
- Step 5: We offer you a place
- Step 6: You accept or decline the place
- Step 7: If you don't get a place at your preferred school





## Transition to Secondary School

- Most secondary transition days are in the last week of June or 1<sup>st</sup> week of July
- Some secondary schools come and speak to pupils in the summer term
- Information is shared with staff in the summer term to ensure a smooth transition
- Reference requests come directly from the schools to which you have applied. Please pass on any relevant information which may be useful e.g. special family circumstances, significant sporting achievements at external clubs, musical examination grades.





### Assessment

- Assessment is ongoing
- Examples of evidence collected: class work; Maths end of unit tests; AR STAR reading tests; Science end of unit tests; past SATs papers
- Revise times tables up to 12 x 12
- We have formal assessment points at the end of each term or unit
- Parent consultations take place in November and March
- Main written report is shared in March
- Final assessment summary is shared in July
- Parent pop-ins give your child an opportunity to share their successes each half term




### SATs

- Y6 SATS information evening for parents in the Spring Term
- SATS week: 13<sup>th</sup> May 2024 16<sup>th</sup> May 2024



- Children will take tests in reading, spelling and grammar and Maths
- Writing is assessed through the work they have independently completed in class
- Final teacher assessments are not submitted until later in the term
- SATs results are reported to you in July in the final CPS Record of Achievement
