Making Spaghetti bridges with Year 5



In Year 5, we have been looking at different bridges such as truss bridges, beam bridges and arch bridges. In pairs, we all created truss bridges out of spaghetti. It was a bit of a challenge since the pieces kept snapping. We used a limit of 8 pieces of spaghetti per beam so it was robust. We

used masking tape to secure all the beams together. We measured 8cm

of spaghetti and snapped it to make smaller equal beams, we then made into triangles. When everyone has finished this type of bridge, we will be making them out of wood!
