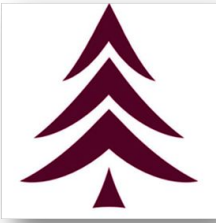

Our Expectations

Independence & Behaviour

- Please ensure your child is clear on where they should be meeting you.
- We expect mobile phones to be switched off before entering the green gate.
- Year 6 pupils are role models for younger pupils and we expect them to make sensible behaviour choices, wear smart uniform and be ready for learning.
- **Remember, KS2 cold weather uniform includes a tie (from October).**

PE Kit to be worn on PE days:

- Grey tracksuit or joggers with a grey sweatshirt or a school maroon sweatshirt for the whole day **(not zipped or hooded as this is unsafe - unzipped zips can cause a nasty injury and hoods can be tempting to grab during competitive sports!)**
- Indoor PE days:
- Shorts, t-shirt and trainers but may wear their tracksuit over this. No need for plimsolls as they usually engage with indoor activities in bare feet

Equipment:

- Children need to have rulers, pencils, blue pen, rubber, glue stick, optional colouring pencils/pens
- Birthday books for class library are welcome; sweets are not given out due to consideration of allergies and religious reasons. Children may wear Mufti on their birthday.



Attendance and Punctuality

- Punctuality is important
- The school gates open at 8.35am and learning starts promptly at 8.45am with a learning task and interventions. Children who are late will miss learning; miss feedback on previous learning or intervention groups; the outline of the day; and self-esteem/social skills can be impacted
- Too many of our children are regularly missing school – **the government expects a minimum of 96% attendance**
- *Missing learning leaves children vulnerable to falling behind. Children with poor attendance tend to achieve less in both primary and secondary school (DfE)*



Attendance and Punctuality

EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS

Don't miss out on the education you deserve.



You could receive a penalty notice if you take your child out of school during term time.

No term time holidays will be authorised.

There are 175 non-school days per year: please use these days for appointments



Attendance Protocol

- **Contact the office via phone or email if your child is absent.** If we do not hear from you, our absence protocol is triggered and you will be contacted for safeguarding purposes
- **CPS follows NHS guidance** (the '48-hour rule'): *“Children with diarrhoea or vomiting should stay away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days (48 hours)”*
- Attendance is monitored closely by the school and the LA Inclusion Officer
- ***Attendance below 90% is classed as ‘Persistent Absence’ and may result in a referral to the LA Inclusion Officer.*** This may also result in a penalty notice or prosecution

Timetable

- PE is on **Friday** and children should come to school in their PE kit. We send PE & Swimming timetables half termly.
- Swimming: Monday = Cedar; Tuesday = Hawthorn.
- Children should wear PE kit on a swimming day
- Children should change back into uniform after a morning club
- Home learning is set via Google Classroom (see next slide)
- Enrichment every **Wednesday** will be **Computing (Hawthorn) and Woodland Learning (Cedar)** this term.



Home Learning

- Maths and English home learning is set via Doodle on Friday and due to be completed by the following Friday.
- Home learning club on a Wednesday lunchtime offers children safe space and support to complete home learning.
- Spellings to practise at home. Feel free to test at home too. The children are tested on 7 current spellings and 3 from previous weeks.
- Useful websites – TTrockstars, Doodle, Accelerated Reader (use the link on Google Classroom to log in).

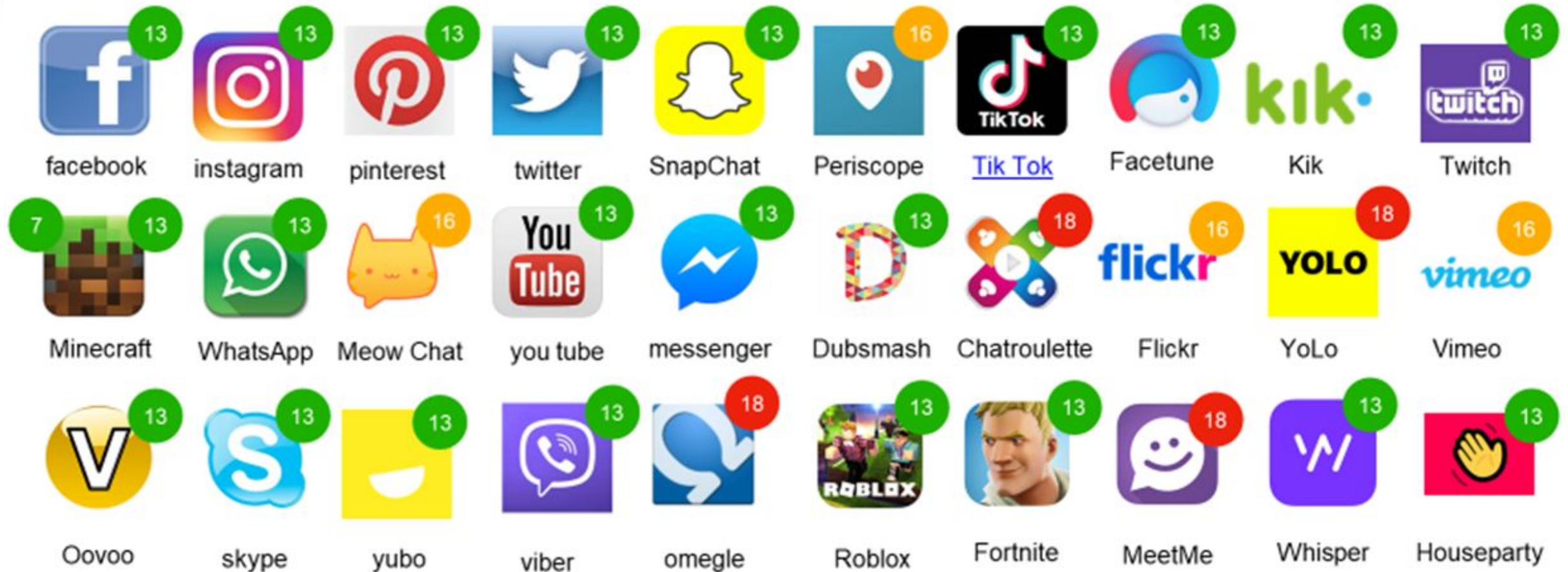


Online Safety

- Taught explicitly through our PSHEE and Computing curriculum, plus regular discussion and direct teaching whenever Chromebooks are used
- Consider children's online access
- 4 Cs: Content, Contact, Conduct and Commerce
- Social media: many apps have a minimum age use e.g. WhatsApp is 16 years old.
- Check privacy settings and monitor usage
- Where are devices stored? Is there unlimited access e.g. in bedrooms?
- Speak to school staff if you have concerns or need support
- **We are Smartphone free** – children in Y6 may bring a 'brick' phone into school

Did you make any good mistakes today?

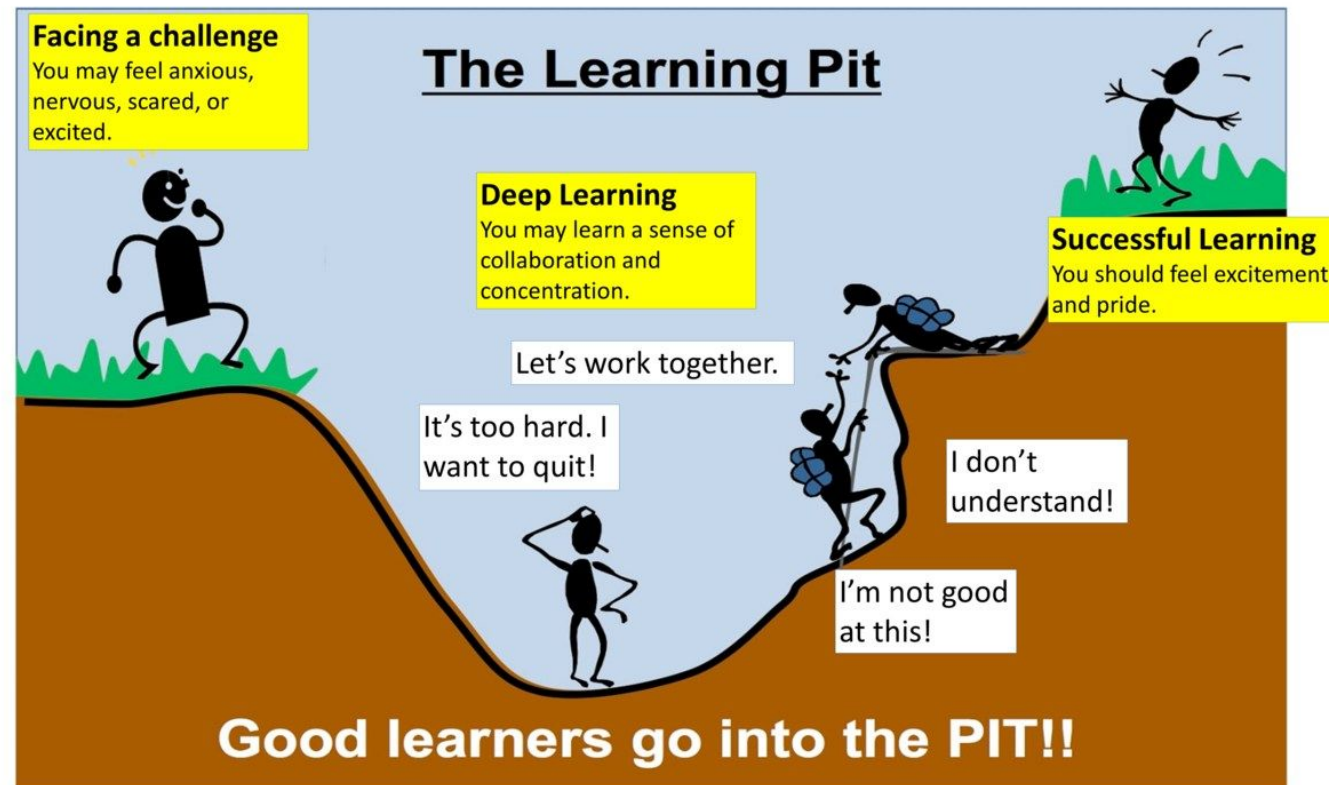
How did you learn from your mistakes today?

Without voluntary donations, trips may not be able to go ahead.

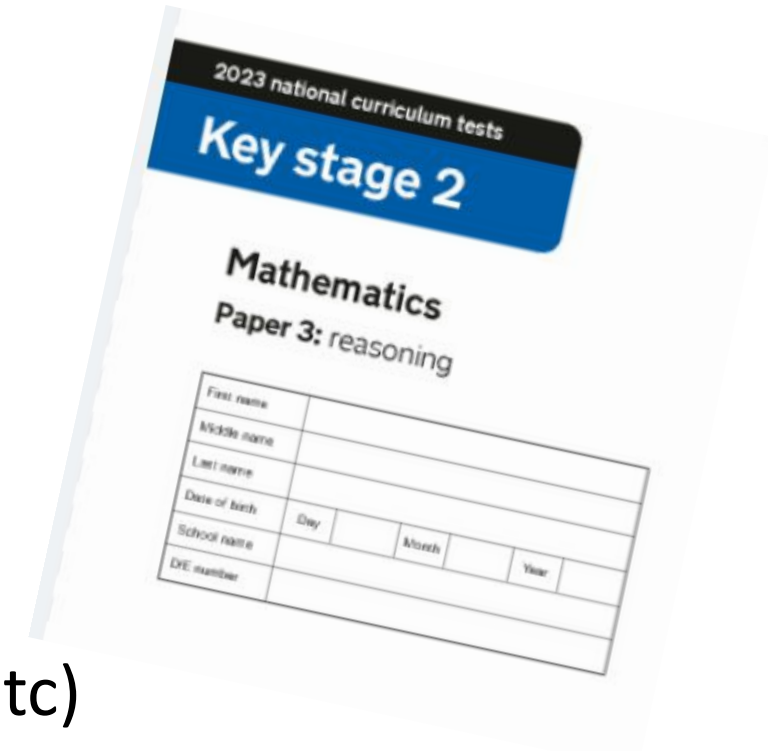


Assessment

> Year 7 staff meet with Y6 teachers to share information

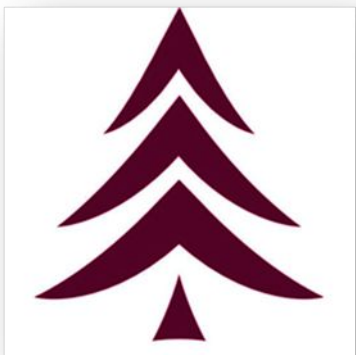
> Most secondary schools also send a representative to meet with Y6 pupils in the summer term
