We have had a huge focus on Internet Safety this week as it was Internet Safety Day on Tuesday. Mr Godfrey delivered two assemblies and our computing lessons this week have also had an E-Safety focus; please see the attached flyer.

We also had our half termly fire drill and we were very pleased with how sensible our children were, evacuating promptly. Our Reception children in particular impressed us as they evacuated via different routes to those they are accustomed to due to their library and music sessions.

Illness: We know that illness is unavoidable and to be expected. However it is very important to inform the school on the first day of absence with the reason either by phone (01372 465 348), or in person at the school office. Our EWO has visited and is concerned at the high percentage of holidays which are taken at CPS...

### Did You Know....?

- For every day of school missed by a pupil it will reduce their attendance by 0.5%.
- Ten whole days of school has been missed if your child has 95% attendance.
- Twenty whole days of school has been missed if a pupil's attendance is 90%.
- By the time a pupil is persistently absent (85% attendance) they have missed 6 weeks or half a term of schooling.

Naturally this impacts on learning, however many children find 'being out of the loop' and revisiting learning which they missed first time around very stressful. Also time away from school can impact on children's friendship groups and ability to chat about what they missed the previous day within their social circles.

This week, training was all about phonics and spelling. Staff welcomed another session with Lindsay Pickton; an experienced Teaching and Learning Advisor specialising in Primary Literacy, who we worked with to focus on the writing process and Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPAG) during 2019-2020. We are delighted that he was impressed with how we are developing a progressive scheme across the school with discrete spelling sessions since he last visited and he shared further strategies and activities to support the teaching of SPAG.

Our INSET session on Friday will enable the team to reflect further and adapt planning to include some of these ideas but the majority of time is to focus on the CPS curriculum offer, particularly across the foundation subjects to ensure all links are planned, sequenced and add to the children's learning experience through discrete lessons and, where appropriate, through strong cross curricular links.

As we approach the end of half term, we were again treated to Enrichment performances; thank you to Mrs Lasebikan and Mrs Ali for showcasing the children's talents; always a highlight! We were very impressed indeed. The outdoor learning team were also buzzing about their Woodland Learning and their fire lighting finale (and of course smores!). The children have also enjoyed participating in the RSPB Big Schools' Birdwatch; isn't it surprising how many birds we can spot in Claygate!

Monday 24th February is National Thinking Day so the children are welcome to wear their Scout, Guides etc uniforms and again this reminds us that our FRIENDSHIP Value goes beyond our school gates.

As I am sure you are aware, Clubland hire the use of our school to run wrap around care for our children. This includes the use of the lower playground and climbing apparatus. It has been brought to my attention that some children are entering the bottom playground to play and use the apparatus after school. There have been multiple occasions where Clubland's use of the area has been impacted due to non-Clubland children accessing their zones. This also raises a safeguarding issue. I am sure this access has been granted by parents not appreciating the impact on Clubland, I would like to draw your attention to this and request that in future all parents leave the site promptly with their children.

Reception and Years 1 & 2 are provided with Free School Meals and do not have to top-up!


