Another busy and exciting week of learning at CPS plus a trip to Reeds for Pine Class on Thursday to complete the Launch Car Challenge (Aspen to go next Thursday). The children also enjoyed a visit from Jay (multisports) to discuss how we can keep active and healthy; so important to us all!

We had our next scheduled visit from Laura Dobson; a reading consultant who we have engaged to facilitate the effective teaching and progressive development of Reading Skills across the school. Mrs Moorhouse, our Reading Lead, Mrs Ali, Laura and I observed lessons, talked to children and heard readers across the school. We also looked at planning and work produced. This is linked with our Strategic Development plan Reading priority.

As noted in last week's newsletter, after our successful Parents' Forum, we plan to hold Ofsted update information sessions after half term. The consensus was that these would be evening sessions in the main:

Equally if your children span different year groups, you are welcome to attend as many sessions as you wish, noting again that some of the information will be generic, or one! 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One outcome from Parents' Forum was sharing a 'one liner' re upcoming learning focus to compliment the topic web information each week. We will look at the best way to share this information and roll this out after half term. Our new Reading Records contain some useful spelling lists too. We have also began to create a guide about reading working with some of our parents: we are creating a leaflet, and then we will look at similar leaflets for other subjects. On our website there are some useful sections as well as for spelling, maths etc and again we are working on adding greater detail for you to really understand learning for your child at each stage of their journey.

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I would also like to remind you that your child's Spring Record of Achievement will be sent home on March 9th (If an additional copy needs to be sent to a parent at a different address please notify the Office). The children's end of year summary, Claygate Charter Certificate of achievement and their Celebration Evening of Learning will be in the summer term as usual. Spring Parent Consultation evenings are March 10th and 12th. Parents with children with additional needs will have the opportunity to book a longer session after reports are sent out.

Mrs Mak who left last year to have her baby returned briefly from maternity leave working Fridays and has now decided to leave; we wish her well and every happiness for the future! Mrs Bridger, leaves us next Thursday; she is setting up her own business and we wish her every success in her new venture. We are pleased that keeping in touch through will be easy as we will see her with her 'Mum's hat' on! We are also delighted to have successfully appointed a very experienced early year's practitioner who is a qualified Early Years ELSA and Forest School Teacher too. We are looking forward to having the section fenced on the run up to school so the younger children have their very own Mini Woodies Zone, so Mrs Buttery will be a huge asset, driving improvement in the EYFS offer.

CPS has registered to take part in the RSPB Big Schools' Birdwatch 2020 over the next two weeks. Our Charter groups: Gardening and Woodland Explorers have already made bird feeders for our allotment and Woodland Learning Zone, to encourage the birds. Outdoor learning is so important and we are lucky to have won funding from the Coop Charity token system to enable us to commission a 'traversing wall' and some climbing poles with the money they have donated for this purpose. Thank you to the team who actioned the bid for this funding and helped make this happen ready for the warmer weather.

Miss Jenkins who is our Science Lead and I had a very productive meeting with Surbiton Golf Club. Did you know they are 125 years old? (The club, that is!). They are really keen to explore ways of working with us both here with our Woodland Learning provision as well as at the club itself; they were impressed with our site, our pets, our values and of course our Claygate Charter and were immediately keen to get involved! Their knowledge and passion for the environment was evident; they even have badgers! So we are really looking forward to developing this partnership!

Update re our Swimming Pool Project

We would like to share with you some really positive progress with our swimming pool project. A massive £290,000 of funding has been secured from Elmbridge Borough Council, Claygate Parish Council and the London Marathon. With the money pledged from the Parents Association we now have £340,000 in place. The funding secured does have conditions attached from our funders that it is dedicated directly to the pool project and to enable wider use of the pool for the benefit of the school and local community. There are a number of other funding initiatives underway to hopefully help us reach our target of £500,000.

Following a lengthy tender process we are delighted to have also now appointed a contractor to take the project forward. The first steps will include a thorough survey of the existing swimming pool and working up the detailed design of the building within our budget.

This project is ambitious and offers a great many benefits to the school for many years to come. Whilst many school pools are having to close we would like to secure the future of ours and take the opportunity to forge stronger links with the local Claygate community.
